## **MEMBERS AT LARGE:**

**Leslie A. Anderson\***

### **Plainfield**

Leslie is the President and CEO of the New Jersey Redevelopment Authority (NJRA), a multi-million dollar independent financing authority created by the state of New Jersey to transform urban communities through direct investment and technical support. Leslie is the first African-American woman to helm an independent financing authority in New Jersey and thanks to her tenacity, effectiveness, and vision she has been reappointed to this position by three consecutive governors. Under her bold leadership, NJRA has used its financial resources to leverage over \$3.8 billion in new investments, helping to redevelop some of New Jersey's most economically challenged neighborhoods. Moreover, the authority committed \$418 million in direct investments in its eligible communities. This has led to the creation of 15,000 new housing units and 10 million square feet of commercial and retail space. In 2006, Leslie created the NJRA Redevelopment Training Institute (RTI) to provide learning opportunities centered on the complexities of redevelopment and best practices for community revitalization. Since its inception, RTI has trained over 2,000 attorneys, elected officials, developers, and non-profits. It has also received certification from the American Institute of Certified Planners, the Northeastern Economic Developers Association, and Continuing Legal Education through the NJ Supreme Court. Leslie began her career in her hometown of Plainfield, New Jersey where she spent nearly a decade working in the city's economic development office. She began her tenure as a planner, but after distinguishing herself, Leslie was promoted several times and ultimately selected by the mayor to serve as the Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development. Leslie remains heavily involved in the Plainfield community. She is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., which is a public service organization that strives to confront the problems facing disadvantaged African Americans. Leslie has served in various leadership positions in the organization including as the president of the Central Jersey Alumnae Chapter. Leslie is also president of the New Horizons College Club (NHCC) Board of Directors, headquartered in Plainfield, NJ. The program mentors high school students that are seeking to further their academic goals by attending college. Leslie's commitment to service has earned her numerous awards and recognition. In March, she had the distinction of being named as one of NJBIZ's Best 50 Women in Business. In 2016, she was recognized by the Black Alumni of Penn State University for her outstanding work in public service. Leslie is also the 2014 recipient of the Chester Holmes Humanitarian Award; the 2014 recipient of the Chris Kjeldsen Community Service Award; the 2010 recipient of the Garden State Bar Association's Roger M. Yancey Award (one of three non-lawyers to receive this prestigious award); the 2004 recipient of the Girl Scouts of Delaware Raritan Woman of Distinction Award; and a 2003 inductee in the Plainfield High School Hall of Fame. Leslie earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science at Pennsylvania State University and is pursuing a Master's in Public Service Leadership at Thomas Edison State University.

**Diane M. Genco**  
**Westfield**

Diane has worked with families for over thirty years. Born in Buffalo, NY, she received a BS in Human Development, Family and Community Relations from the State University College at Buffalo. She then earned her MS in Education and Child Care Administration from Lesley University in Cambridge, MA. Diane has worked for NJSACC: The Statewide Network in New Jersey for 24 years in positions of increasing responsibility. As Board Chair she spearheaded the first strategic plan that moved the organization from a volunteer, membership organization through incorporation to a mid-sized not-for-profit with a true statewide reach. In 2000 Diane was appointed as the first Executive Director of NJSACC, a position she still holds. NJSACC is a founding member of the National AfterSchool Association (NAA) and NJSACC is the NJ State Affiliate. NJSACC is identified as national leader in informal STEM in afterschool and most recently for NJSACC's new work on aligning the afterschool program with the Common Core Standards. In NY State she served five summers as a Director of a summer arts camp which provided the children of migrant farm workers an enriching summer learning experience, full time child care as well as individualized academic support. Diane was the lead trainer and facilitator of a three-year program improvement project with Save the Children (USA). Contracted by the National Institute on Out-of-School Time (NIOST), Diane designed and delivered professional development and technical assistance to afterschool programs funded by Save the Children in Appalachia, the Mississippi Delta and the Southwest Native American Reservations. In her broader role as a Training Associate for NIOST, she has trained school administrators and afterschool professionals in 42 states, England and Canada. Diane was the Executive Director of the Lawrence Extended Day Program (LEDP) in Brookline, Massachusetts, for 11 years. This program is parent-controlled and works in close coordination with the public school. LEDP, during Diane's tenure, was selected in 1979 as a United Nation's model site for the International Year of the Child. In 2002, she spear-headed a dynamic learning exchange with educators in the United Kingdom (UK). Diane led a Study Tour in 2006 to the UK to visit full-service schools, academies (with expanded learning time) and afterschool programs. She has hosted several Study Tours from the UK in NJ. This learning exchange program is still active today. Diane has also served the afterschool community through her participation as a board member of various statewide and national organizations: the Inaugural Board of NJ After 3, appointed by Governor Jim McGreevy, the NJ Department of Education's No-Child Left Behind Advisory Council, 21st CCLC Advisory Council, the NJ Child Care Advisory Council, and as a member of the National AfterSchool Association (NAA) Board of Directors. Diane is also very much involved in community organizations having served on the boards of: Westfield Day Care Center, Westfield Area Y, Westfield Education Fund, and the Plainfield YMCA. She currently serves as Ambassador for Premiere Stages at Kean University. In her personal life, Diane is involved in the restoration of Greenwood Gardens, a 28-acre public garden in Short Hills, NJ. She works closely on developing the Children's Garden at Rutgers Gardens, New Brunswick, NJ, and serves as an active member of the National Gathering Team for the National Children and Nature Network, founded by author Richard Louv (Last Child in the Woods). She is an avid gardener, raises Monarch butterflies for release and is committed to reconnecting youth to nature.
